Developed in partnership with Venn Academy Trust and The Gorse Academy Trust, this programme reflects a shared commitment to high-quality education, inclusion, and leadership excellence, ensuring that all pupils benefit from expert teaching.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

A three-year pathway supporting teachers from skilled practitioners to emerging leaders:

Year 3: Developing Expertise

- Build foundational leadership skills and deepen subject knowledge.
- Develop adaptive teaching strategies and classroom management.
- Begin subject leadership responsibilities, focusing on action planning and pupil progress.

Year 4: Embedding Expertise

- Strengthen leadership skills, aincluding monitoring and feedback.
- Deepen understanding of SEND, with astrategies for supporting pupils with:
- Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Structured routines, visual supports, and communication strategies.
- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Strategies for focus, movement breaks, and self-regulation techniques.
- Dyslexia and Dyspraxia Assistive technology, amultisensory learning, and motor skills support
- Speech, Language and Communication Needs (SLCN)
 Scaffolded conversations, visual aids, and language interventions.
- Sensory Processing Disorders (SPD) Sensory-friendly environments, movement integration, and de-escalation techniques.
- Hearing or Visual Impairments (HI/VI) Adapted learning materials, signposting, and assistive technologies.
- Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties (PMLD) Personalised approaches, sensory learning, and specialist support.
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) Needs Trauma-informed approaches, relationship-based interventions, and resilience-building activities.
- Self-Regulation Strategies Emotion coaching, mindfulness techniques, and cognitive-behavioural approaches to support emotional and behavioural regulation.
- Engage in collaborative approaches, such as lesson study and research projects.

Year 5: Enhancing Expertise

- Master adaptive teaching tailored to diverse pupil needs.
- Mentor Early Career Teachers (ECTs) and contribute to whole-school improvement initiatives.
- Lead impactful curriculum initiatives across the school.
